## TRAINING PROGRAMMES

### Capacity Building

A training programme on the development of the capacity of newly recruited Junior Engineers (JEs) of RWSS organization was conducted at Indira Gandhi Public Health Laboratory, Palasuni, Bhubaneswar from 20<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> July 2005. The objective was to familiarize these engineers with the Total Sanitation Campaign and the Swajaldhara scheme

### Training Programmes for Masons
